**JESUS THE SON, LEAD US TO THE FATHER
THROUGH THE SPIRIT**

Today's feast invites us to live in the awareness of the presence of the Triune God within us: The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The mystery of the Holy Trinity is one of the fundamental doctrines of Christianity and the greatest mystery of our Faith, namely, that there are Three Divine Persons, sharing the same Divine nature in one God.

“There is one God, who has three Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Each Person is God, yet there is still only one God”

We have the Father Who is the Creator, the Son Who is the Redeemer and the Holy Spirit Who is the Sanctifier and the Counsellor – One God. Throughout the world, church bells ring three times a day inviting Christians to pray to the Holy Trinity, giving glory to the Triune God for the Incarnation of the Son and our Redemption.

The doctrine of Three Persons in one God, co-equal and co-eternal in Divinity yet distinct in Person, is not explicitly spelt out in the Bible. Even the very word “Trinity” is not found in the Bible. But the doctrine of the Trinity underlies all major Christian feasts, including Christmas, the Epiphany, Good Friday, Easter, the Ascension and Pentecost. All the official prayers of the Church, including the Holy Eucharist and the Sacraments, begin with an address to the Holy Trinity: “*In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.*” We are baptized, absolved of our sins and anointed in the name of the Blessed Trinity.

What does the Holy Trinity teach us?

- 1) **We need to respect ourselves and respect others.**
Our conviction that the Triune God is present within us always should help us to esteem ourselves as God's holy dwelling place, to behave well in His holy presence, and to lead purer and holier lives, practicing acts of justice and charity. This Triune Presence should also encourage us to respect and honour others as "Temples of the Holy Spirit".
- 2) **We need to be aware of God as the Source of our strength and courage.**
The awareness and conviction of the presence of God within us gives us the strength to face the manifold problems of life with
