

JESUS BRINGS GOOD TIDINGS

Finally, it's Christmas! This is the most awaited feast that we Christians celebrate. We consider Christmas as the encounter, the great encounter, the historical encounter, the decisive encounter, between God and mankind. All the prophecies of old found their fulfilment in the birth of Jesus. He is the long-expected saviour. At Christmas we reflect on the mystery of the Incarnation, the coming of the Son of God into the world in the likeness of a human being. It is a mystery beyond all telling, and a recap of God's wonderful act of creation. At creation he made humanity in his own image and likeness, for salvation of human beings, he took the likeness of us.

We gather, because Christ has gathered us together by His birth. This was His mission for coming, to bring us together and reunite us with God (<u>Eph 1:7-20</u>). He became one of us in order to enter deeply into the fullness of our being to redeem us from the very root of sin that disconnected us from God the father. His birth has a purpose just as your and my birth has a purpose. He has a mission to accomplish. It was obedience to the will of His father that saw him through on that mission. So if we are to succeed in life, we too must be obedient to His commands. His birth was a gift to us. A gift borne out of selfless and unconditional love for man. He became a gift to men and women that we, in turn, shall be a gift to others. It was a selfless gift to men, to teach us that it is only in selfless service that we accomplish God's designs and fulfilment of our mission here on earth.

There is abundance of colour, merriment and joy all around. Yet despite all these exciting events and gatherings, we cannot fail to notice the superficiality and even the emptiness of the celebration for many people. The reason is simple. Like the people of Bethlehem, many of us respond with the same attitude and disposition: "There is no room in our inn". Yes, we have room for almost everything associated with Christmas – parties, carolling, dancing, shows, decorations, and many things besides. They fill up not only our calendars but also our minds and hearts during these days, that we have no more room for the newborn Saviour. He knocks at the door of our hearts, wanting to enter and be part of our life. Unfortunately, we are already too occupied with the superficial and material concerns and activities.

"How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the one who brings glad tidings" (Is. 52:7). The Christmas celebrations involve a lot of travelling. In most Christian cultures, people travel to visit family, friends and loved ones. Some of those visits are out of nostalgia, some, out of compulsion. Some people are full of anticipation as they anticipate these visits, while others full of trepidation. Some families use this period to broker peace, while some others fall apart after their
