

## From Fr Neil

#### Whoever believes in Jesus shall live

In the first reading prophet Ezekiel is given a vision of a valley filled with dry bones, which represent the people of Israel who are dead in their exile. The Lord promises to put his spirit within them and restore them to life, bringing them back to their own land. Responsorial Psalm is a psalm of supplication and trust in the Lord's mercy and redemption. The psalmist cries out to the Lord from the depths and acknowledges that with the Lord there is forgiveness and plenteous redemption and encourages Israel to wait for the Lord and trust in his word. In the Second Reading – Paul teaches that those who live according to the flesh cannot please God, but those who live according to the Spirit have the Spirit of Christ within them and will have life. He declares that the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead dwells within believers and gives life to their mortal bodies.

Today's Gospel records the raising of Lazarus. The raising of Lazarus is a revelation, a sign, a pledge of the power Jesus has over death. This past week we've heard Chapter 5 of St John's Gospel. There Jesus said: As the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so also the Son gives life to whom he will... Truly, truly, I say to you, he who hears my word and believes him who sent me, has eternal life; he does not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life (21,24).

In today's Gospel we see Jesus at the tomb of his friend: distressed, anguished, weeping. This a sign and foretaste of his own passion, which is clearly imaged in the details of the burial cave with a stone over its entrance, and in the burial cloths of Lazarus. The reaction of Jesus shows also that suffering and death come not from God, but from sin. God's response to our suffering is seen in Jesus: in his tears, his prayer, his grief, and in the horror of his own death. This event is a sign of hope for believers, as it points to the victory of life over death. The gospel also illustrates the reality of human suffering and the pain that comes with loss, as well as the compassion and empathy that Jesus shows towards those who are grieving.

It points in a twofold way to Jesus's power over the grave, that he's going to show us on Easter Sunday when he rises from the dead, and it also points forward to our own resurrection on the last day at the end of time when he will give life to us. Andrew of Crete was an Eastern Church Father, and he gave a homily on the raising of Lazarus which is basically written in a kind of song form where Jesus is speaking to Lazarus. And it's a meditation on Jesus's words, "Come out!" Where Jesus commands him to come out of the tomb. This is what Andrew of Crete said: "Lazarus, Come out!... As a friend, I am calling you; as Lord I am commanding you...Come out! ...Let the stench of your body prove the resurrection. Let the burial linen be undone so that they can recognize the one who was put in the tomb. Come out!... Come out of the tomb. Teach them how all creation will be enlivened in a moment when the trumpet's voice proclaims the resurrection of the dead".

So what Andrew is saying here is that, meditating on the words of Jesus, that in a sense, we should put ourselves into Lazarus's place because one day we too will die. And our bodies will decompose, and most of us are going to be in the grave a lot longer than four days, and yet that decomposition of our bodies, that experience of death, that experience of the tomb, is no barrier to life. It's no barrier to the friendship of Christ because on the last day, Christ will call us forth from our graves as our friend if we've lived in friendship with him. And he will command us as our Lord, the one who made the heavens and the earth, to come out of the tomb and to experience the resurrection of the dead, the new creation, and the life of the world to come.
