We can sum up Jesus' mission in the world by saying that he came to teach us a new way of thinking. Through signs, teaching and example he invited us to re-order out priorities.

It will mean thinking of others before ourselves.

The readings today conspire to demonstrate what will happen if we choose Jesus' way.

When Solomon was told to ask God for anything he wanted, he did not think of himself but of the people he was called to lead. Accordingly he asked for wisdom and understanding. God granted his wish of course, and added other blessings too.

The second reading aims at removing our worries by pointing out that *All things* work together onto good for those who love God.

The blessings which overflow in the first two readings are characteristic of those who make their way into the Kingdom which Jesus came to establish. This Kingdom is the assembly of those who think differently.

It is a hidden treasure waiting to be discovered. It is a pearl of great price, really worth having. It is as a net, encompassing the whole world and all the people. But only those with open eyes will choose to remain there.

Let us listen of Jesus' concluding question: "Do you understand?". And we say: "Yes".
