

LOVE GOD THROUGH YOUR NEIGHBOUR

This week's Gospel follows close behind the Gospel read last Sunday. It is the last of three questions put to Jesus by Jewish religious leaders who are trying to trick him into saying something that might get him arrested. This reminds us that the context for today's reading is the mounting tension between Jesus and the religious leaders in Jerusalem.

The Herodians and the Pharisees asked the first question, which was about taxes. The Sadducees asked the second question, which was about the Resurrection (see Matthew 22:22-33). The third question, considered in today's Gospel, is asked by a Pharisee who asks Jesus about the greatest of the commandments. Jesus sums up the law with love for God and neighbour. This theme focuses on the core ethical guidelines in religious practice. Jesus unifies love for God and love for neighbour into a single teaching. This shows the interconnectedness of religious devotion and social ethics.

Today, the church reminds us of the most important theological virtue, love. In a most special way, Jesus gives us the two dimensions of love. Jesus presents us with, first the vertical dimension of love: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your soul....". It is important to note that to love God with one's body and soul requires a lot of sacrifice, and humility. To love God is the most important perquisite of being like him.

The second dimension of love is the horizontal: "You must love your neighbour as yourself?" This is more difficult than the first. This is because, we neglect and take it for granted. This is, by thinking that we can love God alone without loving our neighbours.

Hence, Christ reminds us that: "If anyone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother/sister whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen" (1Jn 4, 20). So, the best way of expressing our love for God is through our neighbours.

The Gospel emphasizes that love is not just a feeling, but also an action. It suggests that genuine love for God manifests in love for others. Therefore, in talking of love, charity must begin at home, with your neighbour, with your friends and those around you. When these are perfectly lived, a Christian can conveniently say, I have lived well.




