From Fr Neil

WE ARE CALLED TO BE HOLY

Today the Church celebrates her dignity as "mother of the saints, image of the eternal city", and manifests her beauty as immaculate bride of Christ, the source and exemplar of all holiness. She does not lack for riotous and indeed rebellious children, but it is in the saints that she recognizes her characteristic traits and precisely in them she Savors her deepest joy. In the first reading the author of the Apocalypse describes "a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people and tongue" (Revelation 7:9). Among this multitude are not only the officially recognized saints but the baptized of every age and nation who have sought to accomplish the divine will with love and fidelity. Many there are whose faces and names we do not know but with the eyes of faith we see them shine like stars full of glory in the divine firmament. What was common to them was the will to incarnate the Gospel in their existence through the impulse of the Holy Spirit, who is the eternal giver of life of the people of God.

A veil of mystery hides what lies in store for human beings beyond this mortal life here and now. St Paul recognises this fact when he says that "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, nor has it entered the human heart to imagine what God has prepared for those who love him." [1 Cor 2:9]. Still, the holy Scriptures provide a wealth of hopeful images to give a foretaste of what lies in store beyond this world, for those who love God. Those in heaven are no plaster saints but a glorious band of decent people who lived with such love, they went straight back to the God they loved so well. Some who have inspired the church for centuries, and other unsung heroes, living a quiet life of kindness and duty, pure of heart and gentle of spirit.

Who are we? St John answers that beautifully in our second reading: we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. (1 John 3:2). If we know who we are, we will know how to act. All Saints today reminds us of who we are and what a bright future can be ours. We are joyful that they have reached the goal of life: heaven. They remind us to keep our sights fixed high, to remember who we are and the glorious possibility that God offers us.

The saints encourage us in our own struggles because like us they also endured struggles, they grew from strength to strength, and they matured in the Lord as they grew in years. We also see this journey of growth in the great people of the Bible. Moses had a speech impediment, had murdered and protested against being called by God, but he led his people to the Promised Land. In the Gospels, Peter is impulsive and doesn't want the Lord to suffer, but in Acts he is totally transformed and considers it an honour to suffer for the Lord.

Not only the saints' lives but also their writings are precious gifts of grace to us to remind us of who we are and the glory that God is offering to us. We treasure the *Confessions* of St Augustine with its words: "You have made us for yourself O Lord and our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee".



An initial response to this question is this: To be saints it is not necessary to perform extraordinary deeds and works, nor is it necessary to possess exceptional charisms. But this only tells us what sainthood is not. The positive answer is that to become a saint it is above all necessary to listen to Jesus and then to follow him and not lose heart in the face of difficulties.


