In the darkness, a light shines

Finally, it's Christmas! This is the most awaited feast that we Christians celebrate. We consider Christmas as the encounter, the great encounter, the historical encounter, the decisive encounter, between God and mankind. All the prophecies of old found their fulfilment in the birth of Jesus. He is the long-expected saviour. At Christmas we reflect on the mystery of the Incarnation, the coming of the Son of God into the world in the likeness of a human being. It is a mystery beyond all telling, and a recap of God's wonderful act of creation. At creation he made humanity in his own image and likeness, for salvation of human beings, he took the likeness of us.

An angel appears, the glory of the Lord shines around the shepherds and finally the message awaited for centuries is heard: "To you is born this day a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Lk 2:11). The angel tells the shepherds how to find the God who has come down to earth: "This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in swaddling clothes, and lying in a manger" (v. 12).

Let us ask ourselves: can we accept God's way of doing things? This is the challenge of Christmas: God reveals himself, but men and women fail to understand. He makes himself little in the eyes of the world, while we continue to seek grandeur in the eyes of the world, perhaps even in his name. God lowers himself and we try to become great. The Most High goes in search of shepherds, the unseen in our midst, and we look for visibility, to be seen. Jesus is born in order to serve, and we spend a lifetime pursuing success. God does not seek power and might; he asks for tender love and interior littleness. Jesus comes to our experience of feeling weak, frail, inadequate, perhaps even "messed up". As in Bethlehem, the darkness of night overwhelms us, but only the light of Christ can dispel the darkness.

As we take a look at the crib, in the distance, we glimpse the Magi, journeying to worship the Lord. As we look more closely, we see that all around Jesus everything comes together: not only do we see the poor, the shepherds, but also the learned and the rich, the Magi. Everything is unified when Jesus is at the centre: not our ideas about Jesus, but Jesus himself, the living One. Let us gaze upon the child given to us this day; let us receive his smile, the smile of God. Let us allow ourselves to smile back, and let us know that life is good, that we are good, and let us bring the hope that is born of such a smile to the world around us this Christmas.

As a pilgrim Church let us return to Bethlehem, let us return to the origins: to the essentials of faith, adoration and charity. Let us go to Bethlehem, where God is in man and man in God. There the Lord takes first place and is
