

From Fr Neil

CHRIST IS RISEN INDEED, ALLELUIA

I begin by wishing you all a very happy Easter full of joy with every blessing and the fullness of life in God that we celebrate on this special day. The Feast of Easter, the Feast of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, is the central Feast of our faith and the Church.

The Resurrection of Christ is the basis of our Christian Faith. It is the greatest of the miracles, for it proves that Jesus is God. That is why St. Paul writes: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain; and your Faith is in vain" (I Cor 15:14). "Jesus is Lord, He is risen" (Rom 10:9) was the central theme of the kerygma (or "preaching"), of the Apostles.

Easter is the guarantee of our own resurrection. Jesus assured Martha at the tomb of Lazarus: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me will live even though he dies..." (Jn 11:25-26).

Easter is a feast that gives us hope and encouragement in this world of pain, sorrows, and tears. It reminds us that life is worth living. It also gives us strength to fight against temptations and freedom from unnecessary worries and fears.

Easter gives meaning to our prayers: It supports our belief in the Real Presence of the Risen Jesus in and around us, in His Church, in the Blessed Sacrament, and in Heaven, hearing our prayers, and so gives meaning to our personal as well as our communal prayers.

Neither the Jews nor the Romans could disprove Jesus' Resurrection by presenting the dead body of Jesus.

The Apostles and early Christians would not have fearlessly preached Christ as Savior and faced martyrdom if they were not absolutely sure of Jesus' Resurrection.

The Apostle Paul's conversion from a persecutor of Christians to a zealous preacher of Jesus supports the truth of Jesus' Resurrection (*Gal 1:11-17*, *Acts 9:1*, *Acts 9:24-25*. *Acts 26:15-18*).

Our celebration of Easter places before us the hope of new life. That which seems too good to be true, is still to come to us. Christ's resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power that has permeated this world. Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force. Often it seems that God does not exist: all around us, we see persistent injustice, evil, indifference, and cruelty. But in the midst of darkness, something new always springs to life and sooner or later produces fruit.

However dark things are, goodness always re-emerges and spreads. Each day in our world beauty is born anew, it rises transformed through the storms of history, and human beings have risen time after time from situations that seemed doomed.

The messengers ask the women, "Why look among the dead for someone who is alive?" As long as the disciples remain locked in the old world with its old logic they will always look for Jesus among the dead: after all, they had seen him die and they had seen him laid in the tomb, with the stone at the tomb's entrance seeming a cosmic full stop.


