Listen to the voice of God and act

The first reading from Isaiah shows God as actively involved in the world, overseeing empires and individual lives alike. Isaiah's message emphasizes that while human rulers come and go, God is the ultimate authority. This understanding helps people face life's challenges with purpose and trust in God's larger plan. In times of global issues like political unrest, environmental crises, and health pandemics, Isaiah's prophecies offer comfort and hope. They remind us that with faith and perseverance, we can overcome any challenge. God promises to deliver and heal, turning barren landscapes into flourishing life. This is seen in Isaiah where God transforms the dry land into streams of water. Isaiah's prophecy shows God caring for the afflicted. He brings joy and healing to those who suffer.

The Gospel of Mark shows how Jesus heals a deaf man with a speech problem. He looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!" – that is, "Be opened!" – And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke

plainly. This miracle shows Jesus' compassion and power to heal. One key theme in Mark's Gospel is Jesus' identity as both the Son of God and a human being. Mark shows Jesus performing miracles, like healing the deaf man, demonstrating His divine power. Yet, Mark also depicts Jesus experiencing human emotions, emphasizing the humanity of Jesus. Jesus' miracles in Galilee highlight His authority over physical and spiritual realms and proclaim the kingdom of God. This passage reminds us of Jesus' dual nature and His mission to bring God's kingdom to earth.

In the Gospel today Christ gives the gift of hearing. He proclaims "be opened" and the ears of the deaf man suddenly open and can hear. Perhaps we need to pray that our own ears might be opened and we might be able to listen to the voice of God piercing through the chatter and clutter of our own culture in our own time. We pray that we might listen to God's voice coming to us in the poor, the lonely, the broken-hearted, and the abandoned.
